
President's Passage

Money Matters

Thankfully, Paisano has weathered financial challenges created by the COVID pandemic. We have seen faithful giving by our loving Paisano Family and are greatly indebted to the Paisano Foundation for supporting the encampment during this difficult time.

After a net loss of \$30,518 in 2020 and some belt-tightening, God sustained us and continued to bless us in 2021:

Total receipts \$494,606.17 Total expenditures \$414,905.71 Income vs. Expenditures \$79,715.46

At the halfway point of the 2022 fiscal year, faithful giving continues. Receipts are ahead of expenditures but most of Paisano's expenses come in July with general encampment. The Paisano Foundation

As a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization under the IRS code, the Paisano Foundation has only one purpose: to provide financial support for Paisano Baptist Assembly and ensure its longterm stability. The Foundation has no operational involvement, but the Foundation Board's policy is to donate half of the annual earnings to the encampment to address specific needs while investing the other half. High Ground, formerly Baptist Foundation of Texas, holds the funds. The Paisano Foundation provides funds for improvements to infrastructure such as roads and water and meets extraordinary needs such as damage caused by ice storms or helping cover a major shortfall created by a worldwide pandemic. For example, when general encampment was cancelled due to COVID, the Foundation's gift allowed Paisano to make payroll and pay expenses.

Please consider leaving the Foundation a bequest in your will or making a current gift, but please don't contribute what you would otherwise give to the budget, especially in these challenging times. The Foundation's goal is to significantly increase endowment to meet infrastructure needs and provide for emergencies well into the future.

Fuzzy Friends

With the exception of necessary service animals, Paisano discourages individuals from bringing pets to the encampment. Under Paisano Policies adopted in 2014, pets must be under physical control while on the grounds and should only be in personally owned cabins. They should not be brought into Paisanoowned facilities such as the dining shed, tabernacle, nursery, museum, gymnasium, etc.
