President's Passage


Then the Lord said to him, "Go back to the land of your fathers and to your family, and I will be with you." Gen. 31:3

International speakers Scott and Nan are excited to meet the Paisano family this summer! Since 2013, the two have been on short-term trips to India, Indonesia, Haiti, and Jordan. Most were evangelistic in character, with some focusing on training local believers. While in a 25-year IT career, Scott was also a pastor, church leader, and church-planter. He now serves as a mission pastor, mobilizing and training his church and sister churches to help reach unreached peoples.

Scott and Nan work closely with in-country missionaries supported by their church and two different missions agencies and virtually disciple believers in China and India. They are passionate about inspiring lay Christians to work with unreached peoples through short-term missions and by engaging with those who have moved into their US communities.

In the morning sessions, Scott and Nan will seek to equip and encourage a missional approach to everyday life.



Money Matters

We are truly thankful for the faithful giving of the Paisano family, especially this past year. Your gifts allow us to continue doing Paisano the way we do.

Paisano remains in a strong financial position with a cash balance of over \$196,000. For the year ended August 31, 2024, revenue exceeded expenses, and giving was up by \$137,000 with expenses down \$50,000. As a result, the camp went from an operating loss of \$26,000 in FY 2023 to an operating gain of \$155,000 in FY 2024.

As some may know, Sandra and Coach Whiting will shortly wind down their Paisano duties. Angela Becker of Palmetto Ventures in Midland will step in as financial assistant. Having grown up in Valentine, Angela provides similar services to Bloys and is working with Sandra during the transition. Paisano has been blessed by Sandra and Coach and their many years of service. They have truly lived I Peter 4:10, "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms."

Paisano Foundation

The Paisano Foundation, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization under the IRS code, has only one purpose: to provide financial support for Paisano Baptist Assembly and ensure its long-term stability and viability. The Foundation has no operational involvement in the encampment, but the Foundation Board's policy is to donate half of the annual earnings to the encampment to address specific needs while reinvesting the other half. High Ground Advisors holds the funds which enable improvements to infrastructure such as roads and sewer and meets extraordinary needs like pre-funding Elliott Pavilion and new cabin construction or helping cover major shortfalls during COVID when the Foundation's gift allowed Paisano to make payroll and pay expenses.

Consider leaving the Foundation a bequest or making a current gift, but please don't contribute what you would otherwise give to the budget. The Foundation's goal is to significantly increase the endowment to meet infrastructure needs and provide for emergencies well into the future. Contributions are tax deductible. Family Time: Do You See Me?

Ryan Fitch, couples counselor for the Central Texas Veteran's Health Care System in Temple, will lead Family Time on the topic, "Do You See Me?"

Ryan notes that "we each have a need and desire for both physical and emotional safety which we were created to find through relationships." He adds that "during our time together, we will take a closer look at our desire and need for connection in our most important relationships." He hopes to address questions like "What does it mean to be seen, and how do we reach for others?"

Ryan, a licensed LMFT and LPC, graduated from UT Arlington in psychology before enlisting in the Navy. He earned his master's in counseling from the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor with an emphasis in marriage and family. Married nine years to Erin, whom he met through a local church while stationed in South Texas, the couple has three children: Luke (6), Logan (4), and Lacie (1). They are members of Taylor's Valley Baptist Church in Temple.



Fuzzy Friends

With the exception of necessary service animals, Paisano discourages individuals from bringing pets to the encampment. Under Paisano Policies adopted in 2014, pets must be under physical control while on the grounds and should only be in personally owned cabins. They should not be brought into Paisano-owned facilities such as the dining shed, tabernacle, nursery, museum, gymnasium, etc.

Updated Tabernacle Technology

For those with a little trouble hearing, Paisano announces that all services held in the Mitchell Tabernacle will be broadcast live to cell phones using the AudioFetch app. The app allows you to use your cell phone+headphones or Bluetooth hearing aids to hear the service.

To use AudioFetch, download and install the app prior to coming to camp. You will NOT be able to download the app at Paisano due to lack of cell coverage. The AudioFetch App is available for both Apple and Google phone users. Just search in the Apple App Store or Google Play Store for AudioFetch.
